	Our first book this term is Whatever Next by Jill Murphy. Imagine you are going into space with Baby Bear. What might you see? Draw a picture of what you might see and write your own labels for each item.	Look around the house and local environment for different numbers. What numbers can you find? Where did you find the number? Take photos of the numbers or draw pictures of all the different places you found the numbers.	Find a picture of you as a baby. Write a sentence about how you have changed and what you can do now.
**	We will also be looking at traditional tales such as Little Red Riding Hood and Jack and the Beanstalk. What is your favourite traditional tale? Make a story map to retell your favourite traditional tale (see reverse of the sheet for ideas of how to do a story map).	Find 10 objects from around the house. Ask your adult to give you some of the objects to count. How many objects do you have? What if you added one more? How many do you have now? What about if you take one away? How many do you have now?	Draw a picture of a special event that you have been to. It could be a birthday party, a wedding or a festival celebration. Write a sentence to explain what happened.
***	Thinking about your favourite traditional tale draw a picture of your favourite part. Write sentences to explain what your favourite part is and why it is your favourite part.	Roll 2 dice and add the numbers together. • + • = 4 How many different numbers can you make?	Talk to a family member about their childhood. How was it different to yours? What different toys did they have? What games did they play?
