The tasks are ranked accordingly, from I star being the easiest level to 3 stars being the hardest. You can choose which level you complete. If you wish to, you could complete <u>more than</u> three tasks.

	Create a leaflet about a tourist destination in The Alps.	Create bar charts to compare summer and winter temperatures and summer and winter rainfall.	Research what wildlife can be found in the Alps and create a poster to show the different animals and where on the mountains they can be found
**	Research a specific mountain from The Alps and create a fact file. e.g Mont Blanc or Jungfrau.	Research and produce a report about the mountain heights of the Alps and other key facts.	Research a European country that the Alps border and produce a booklet/poster to show key facts – famous landmarks, foods etc.
	Write a non- chronological report comparing The Alps to other mountain ranges.	Create/design a meal that would provide essential energy required for a mountain hike.	Look at the different types of activities people who visit the alps (tourists)take part in and create a holiday brochure for either summer or winter tourists.

Challenge:

Create a collage picture using newspaper / magazines to create a mountain image. Write a diary entry about visiting The Alps. Who has climbed The Alps? Create a fact file about them. What countries border the Alps – are there any famous people who live in these countries you could create a biography about?
