	Write a book review about a story that you know well. Say why you like it and tell us what your favourite part of the book is.	Draw some 2D shapes. Now label the sides and corners. Which shape has the fewest or most sides? Are there any that have the same? Find some 3D shapes and discuss the number of faces on each shape? Describe the 2D shapes on the faces.	Draw and label an animal from this list. owl, fox, cat, badger, mouse. Write some simple facts about your animal. What does it look like? What does it eat? What is its habitat?
	In English we will be thinking about the story 'The Owl Who was Afraid of the Dark'.  Design an imaginary new nocturnal friend for Plop.  Label it with some exciting words. Now write at least three sentences about what your animal likes to eat, where it lives and what special things it can do.	Can you learn your 2 and 10 times table? Are there any numbers that are in both times tables?	Create a piece of artwork about a nocturnal animal e.g. collage, 3D model, painting etc. Write a fact card to explain your creation.
***	Write a poem about night time. Think about what you can hear, see, feel and smell. You can decorate the finished poem. (It doesn't have to rhyme!)	Find lines of symmetry on different 2D shapes. What is a line of symmetry? How many lines have you found on your shape? How many shapes can you find that have lines of symmetry?	Create an information booklet about nocturnal animals. What is your favourite nocturnal animal? Why is it your favourite?

Maths- Money, shape and multiplication and division.

Science- Animals and their habitats.

History- How did we learn to fly?
