Science- This half term we are looking at different materials. Go on a walk around the house or local area. Look for different objects. What are they made from. Take photographs or draw pictures and label them.
	Write an invitation to invite someone to come to tea.	3D shape- Go on a shape hunt around the house. What 3D shapes can you find? Cube, cuboid, cone, sphere, pyramid and cylinder. Take photographs or draw pictures and label them.	Topic— Talk to someone in your family about the toys they played with when they were little. Draw a picture of their favourite toy and label it.
	Choose your favourite sandwich. Make your sandwich and write a set of instructions for someone else to make your sandwich.	Number- Can you practise your adding skills? Roll 2 dice and add the 2 numbers together. What is the total? Write some number sentences in your homework book.	Topic- Imagine that you ate a toy maker. Can you design a new toy for children to play with. What would it look like? What would it do? What would it be made from?
