*	'Bean to Bar' - Find out how chocolate is made. Write a set on instructions showing the process from 'bean to bar' in the factory.	Choose a recipe for a family of 4 meal. Write your essential shopping list for making this dish. Visit the shops or go online to find prices for these individual ingredients. What is the total price for your family meal? Create your own weekly shopping list and add up the total price. Challenge: Can you make your meal for less than £5.00?	Find out what 'fair trade' is. Research different fair-trade products. Collect example wrappers from fairtrade products. Design your own fairtrade chocolate bar and wrapper.
*	Write a letter to Mrs Horton explaining why it is important to buy fair trade products and persuade her to use more fair trade food products at school.	Choose 8 different fruits or vegetables. Locate where these are grown on a world map. Can you find out the distance these foods travel from their origin country to the UK?	Create a 3D model/poster/powerpoint showing the journey of the cocoa bean from being grown to producing a chocolate bar to sell in the shops.
